


Thank You!

The Girls' Track team competed in the Regional Meet held at Oakdale High School on Monday, May 21st, and Tuesday, May 22nd. Sami Jo Kight placed 1st in the 100m dash and 2nd in the 200m dash. Jenna Green placed 4th in both the 100m hurdles and the 300m hurdles. The 4x100 relay team, consisting of Jenna Green, Trinity Washington, Sarah Rafferty, and Sami Jo Kight, placed 3rd. Justus Leprevost also qualified in the 3200m run with a time of 10:30.22, placing 5th. Tre Smith placed 2nd in shotput with a throw of 48-08.25, Alex Maddy placed 3rd with a 47-06.50, and Dylan Baker placed 5th with a 45-04.25. Kenneth Muir placed 3rd in discus with a throw of 125-03, Noah Snyder placed 6th with a 123-06, and Brady Flanigan placed 7th with a 121-09. Leprevost, Morgan, Tessema, Miller, Smith, Maddy, Baker, Muir, Snyder, and Flanigan all moved onto the state meet which was held at Morgan State University in Baltimore on Thursday and Saturday, May 24th&26th. Brady Flanigan finished 3rd in the state with a throw of 139-03 in discus. Noah Snyder placed 4th behind Flanigan with a throw of 138-11. Alex Maddy placed 3rd in the state with a throw of 48-01.75 in shotput. Dylan Baker finished behind Maddy with a throw of 48-11.00. Tre Smith placed 5th in shotput, throwing a 46-10.00. —Jenna Green

English




Seniors Audrey Jones and Morgan Edwards have been chosen to speak at the Graduation Ceremony. —Kailia Pua'auli
