Mr. Carter grew up in Eckhart Mines and graduated from Beall High School in 1974. Mr. Carter decided to pursue the career path of an educator because he had always had an enjoyable education growing up, and he also had a few aunts and uncles

who were teachers. He attended Frostburg State College and graduated in 1978 with a Bachelor of Science in Biology and Secondary Teacher Education. He later graduated from Frostburg State University in 1985 with a Master's Degree in Secondary Administration and Supervision. In 1979, Mr. Carter started his first teaching job as a math teacher at Northern Middle School in Garrett County for grades 6-8. From 1979 until 1983, he was a science teacher for 7th through 12th grades at Flintstone. Mr. Carter transferred to Fort Hill High School and taught Biology and the sciences from 1983-1996. In addition to working for Allegany County Public Schools, he was an Adjunct Professor of Biology at Allegany College of Maryland from 1986-2017. Mr. Carter started his career as the principal as an assistant principal in 1996 at Fort Hill High School and remained there in that position for five years. Mr. Carter became an assistant principal at Braddock Middle School for the 2001 school year. From the 2002 school year until the spring of 2018, Mr. Carter was Principal at Braddock. Starting this April, he joined the Mountain Ridge staff as principal.

Mr. Carter has three children, his daughter Danielle, son Derek, and son Nathanial. 
